<u>Lighthouse: Centre for Human Trafficking Victims</u>: The only organization working exclusively on the issue of human trafficking and modern day slavery in Japan.

<u>Mirai no Mori</u>: NPO creating life-changing outdoor programs for abused, neglected, and orphaned youths in Japan, supporting their growth into happy and successful young adults.

OGA for Aid: Non-profit, public operating foundation, dedicated to assisting disaster survivors through education and business revitalization.

<u>Peace Boat</u>: Works to promote peace, human rights, equal and sustainable development and respect for the environment among Japanese and other Asian country youth.

<u>Place to Grow</u>: A space for creativity, imagination, and inspiration to flourish in post-disaster communities. Survivors and outside volunteers connect, bringing an explosion of positive energy to the community.

Resilience: Dedicated to raising awareness of domestic violence, abuse, moral harassment and other traumatic issues that affect people psychologically. (Website available only in Japanese)
